

How is activePDF able to use the PDF format? Doesn't Adobe® own PDF?

Adobe Systems Incorporated® owns the copyright for the particular data structures and operators that comprise the Portable Document Format (PDF). In an effort to promote the use of PDF as a standard format for electronic document exchange, Adobe grants permission to activePDF and other parties using the copyrighted data structures and operators to:

- ▶ Generate PDF files that conform to the PDF format
- ▶ Develop applications that produce output that conforms to the PDF format
- ▶ Develop applications that are capable of displaying, printing, or interpreting contents of PDF files

Adobe grants this copyright permission under the following conditions:

- ▶ Software accepting PDF as an input format must adhere to access permissions specified in the inputted PDFs
- ▶ Applications using the copyrighted data structures or operators must include an appropriate copyright notice

Adobe holds the following patents covering technologies used in generating PDF files: US Patent Numbers: 5,634,064, 5,737,599, 5,781,785, 5,819,301, 5,860,074, 6,028,583. Adobe licenses these patents on a royalty-free, non-exclusive basis to activePDF and other parties developing software that produces PDF files complying with Adobe's PDF Specification.

All of activePDF's products adhere to Adobe's conditions, and generate PDF files that conform to the latest version of the PDF Specification. This means the PDF files generated via activePDF's products can be used with any other product capable of handling PDF files.

I already run Acrobat Distiller® on my server. Isn't that the same thing as activePDF?

Per the Acrobat Distiller licensing structure, the only time a single license of Acrobat Distiller can **legally** be run on a server is if every desktop client using the server has its own license of Acrobat Distiller. In other words, unless a license of Acrobat Distiller is purchased for each desktop client, using Acrobat Distiller on a server (even a web server) is in direct violation with the Adobe Acrobat® End-Users' Licensing Agreement (EULA).

Adobe also offers Distiller Server®, a server-based PDF

generator that is specifically licensed for server use. Pricing for Distiller Server begins at \$5000 for a 100-user bundle, extending to \$15,000 for an unlimited user license. The EULA for Distiller Server requires authentication of every user accessing the server, making it illegal for most web-based applications. activePDF offers the same functionality with activePDF Server™, which is offered for just under \$1000, with an unlimited user license.

I run Acrobat via OLE from my Visual Basic® program on the server. How is activePDF Toolkit™ different?

As mentioned before, unless every user accessing the Visual Basic program is a licensed user of Acrobat, this configuration is in violation of the Acrobat EULA. Licensed per server, activePDF Toolkit allows users to append, extract, stamp, form-fill, create, stitch, secure, linearize and more, without requiring multiple desktop client licenses. Developers can easily integrate activePDF Toolkit with existing programs to take advantage of its powerful PDF manipulation capabilities.
